- D7 Donations earn a club 10 points for each \$1.00 donated (\$25.00 earns a club 250 points, \$50 earns a club 500 points)
- D8-D27 Donations are based on a per member basis up to the maximum points allowed for that line item. \$1.00/member=100 points, \$2.00/member=200 points, \$3.00/member=300 points, \$4.00/member=400 points, \$5.00/member=500 points.

Line items A1, A2, A3, A4, A5, A6a, A6b, A6c, are **MANDATORY** items that must be completed on time to qualify for the District Achievement Award

Questions concerning points should be addressed to the District Achievement Chairperson. Controversies will be resolved by the District Governor. **Clubs MUST notify the District Achievement Chairperson of any errors or omissions prior to the next report being published.** Clubs will be recognized for their accomplishment at the District meeting at the Fall Conference or the 1st Cabinet Meeting in 2016-2017.

**Club Secretaries:** The current official Achievement Report is the only form that will be accepted for this program. No other format will be accepted. Please total all points earned on the monthly Achievement Report Form before forwarding the report to the Achievement Program Chairperson.
